His wife, Becky, was by his side holding his hand and praying him into the arms of his Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. C.A.M. is survived by his three children, Caroline (11), Alden (9), and CJ (6).

At last count, C.A.M.'s CaringBridge link had reached over 166,000 hits (I told you his team was large!). Reading through these posts and comments, the one prevailing theme is an untiring devotion to his faith.

C.A.M. not only gave us a great example of how to live, but he also showed us how to die. In life, C.A.M. gave generously of his time, his gifts, and his love for his team. In death, his generosity continues.
